

Alaska: Whales & Waterfalls Yacht Adventure

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Trip Highlights

VISIT Admiralty Island National Monument, known as the "Fortress of the Bears" as it has the highest population of brown bears per mile on Earth.

FLY above glaciers, snow-capped mountains, and waterfalls before landing at a historic private lodge for a wild Alaska salmon feast during a three-hour flightseeing adventure.

KAYAK or skiff through the pristine waters of Glacier Bay National Park and other incredible sites along the way, with several chances to paddle and enjoy Alaska's wild landscapes.

EXPLORE protected wilderness areas like Windham Bay, Glacier Bay National Park and Preserve, Fords Terror Wilderness Area, Tongass National Forest and more.

SEE towering glaciers, waterfalls, and cliffs while traversing through the Endicott Arm Wilderness Area.

ENJOY majestic humpback whale watching in Frederick Sound and Icy Strait.

SOAK in natural hot springs on Baranof Island and in a small hot tub on the deck of the yacht.

VIEW seals, otters, sea lions, eagles, porpoises, and other diverse animals during wildlife searches.



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Day One

When you arrive in Juneau, enjoy a complimentary pick-up and transfer to the Silverbow Inn. If you arrive with time to spare, you can either relax at the hotel or explore downtown Juneau's landmarks, historical sites, shops and more.

In the evening, join our Meet & Greet, orientation, and a welcome dinner.

Day Two

Hello Juneau! First settled in the gold rush days, Juneau welcomes you with small town charm and towering glaciers. In the early afternoon, embark on a three-hour flightseeing adventure over the Juneau Icefield, snow-capped mountains and cascading waterfalls*. Land at the historic Taku Glacier Lodge within the Tongass National Forest, where you'll indulge in a wild Alaska salmon feast and learn more about the lodge's history. After lunch, take a stroll on the nearby wilderness trails or simply enjoy the rustic scenery that surrounds you.

Once we return, it's embarkation time! Toast to the riches of Alaska as you sail west toward Icy Strait. Enjoy the stunning sights of nature as the dramatic coastline unfolds.

*Due to the size of the kayaks, paddlers taller than 6'5" and/or with waist sizes wider than 44" may not fit comfortably or at all. The kayaks are only rated for individuals weighing less than 250lbs (including footwear and clothing).

Day Three

Kick-start the morning with a strong cup of coffee and a hot breakfast made by our onboard chef. Energized and snug in your kayak, paddle in the secluded bays of Icy Strait through giant bullwhip kelp that can grow to over 100 feet long*. Join the group in a skiff to a rocky outcropping to watch sea lions play. Or, step into mud boots for a forest hike with your topnotch naturalist guides who have plenty to share about everything Alaska—marine biology, plants, and even geology.

On board, soak it all in as you relax in the hot tub. Tonight, your boat sails into Glacier Bay National Park with a special early entry permit only available on this itinerary.

Day Four

Glacier Bay National Park covers an incredible 3.3 million acres (that's a tad smaller than the state of Connecticut). Most visitors see the same sliver of the park as everyone else. Not you. You're going the furthest and exploring parts that 99% of visitors never go to. Hike the outwash field of glaciers winding down the Fairweather Mountain Range. The cool breeze off the nearby snow and icefields is energizing.

Day Five


At Admiralty Island National Monument, kayak, skiff, and weave in and out of the bays and islets keeping your eyes out for Alaska brown bears and nesting bald eagles. Tlingit call the island Kootznoowoo, meaning "Fortress of the Bear", for its abundant population of brown bears. The island also has the highest density of bald eagles in the world.

We'll also explore Baranof Island, home to the charming town of Sitka and some of Alaska's dense, temperate rainforests.

Our adventure takes us on a scenic hike to Baranof Lake, followed by a stop to relax in the soothing natural hot springs along the Baranof River. For larger groups, we'll split up to ensure a quiet, peaceful connection with nature without disturbing residential areas. When you're not hiking or relaxing in the springs, you can take skiff tours or kayak excursions while keeping an eye out for the island's abundant wildlife.

After another big day, pop up to the bridge to look over charts with your captain and mates.

Day Six

Witness humpback whales (and possibly orcas with some luck) who feed in Frederick Sound seasonally on krill, zooplankton, and herring. Watch for these gentle giants as they feast in these abundant glacial waters. Based on wind and weather, your expedition team has the lineup of adventures all mapped out. Cruise past Five Fingers Lighthouse, Alaska's oldest light station, and The Brothers Islands, where sea lions nap on rocky knobs. Tonight, toast to another big day in Alaska.

Day Seven

Humpback and orca whales are frequent visitors of this Southeast passage. A misty spout is a sure sign they're in the neighborhood. Your captain navigates Windham Bay and Stephens Passage. And you're in for a boot-sucking, paddle-smacking day of adventure with your guide team. The routes are all picked out. Make your choice and make your move. Slip off the kayak launch and take it slow, spotting sea stars and shore birds. Or, take a long wild paddle to the salt chuck at the back of the inlet. It's a landscape of hanging waterfalls and shades of green.

Day Eight


Skiffing up Endicott Arm, harbor seals laze around on icebergs. If the tides are right, slip into Fords Terror, the steep walls of this narrow opening streaked with waterfalls. Back in the Arm, marvel at the deep glacier-carved valleys. It's at the end where you meet the pièce de résistance: Dawes Glacier. Blue ice marches down from the Coast Mountains. With a sharp crack, the white thunder of a calving slice makes a mega-splash. Tonight, celebrate with a festive farewell dinner.

Day Nine

Indulge in fresh baked pastries over one last breakfast. Your crew and new friends wish you heartfelt goodbyes. This morning, transfer to the Juneau airport or to another hotel if you are extending your stay in the area.











Safari Quest


Cabin Deck - Navigator Cabins (C1-C6), Engine Room, Crew Quarters, and Underwater Camera.

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Silverbow Inn

Night 1

Originally built in 1907 as a bakery before expanding to include four buildings, the Silverbow Inn is a historic landmark located in downtown Juneau.

The hotel offers many amenities like complimentary tea and coffee, in addition to evening treats and a full breakfast. The hotel also provides free Wi-Fi, smart TVs, two hot tubs, two fire pits, and an on-site restaurant with a wine and beer bar.

Navigator Cabin

\$11,995 USD per person (double occupancy) -Cabins C1 - C6

Located on the cabin deck of the boat, Navigator Cabins can be configured with king, queen, or twin beds, with an elevated window that provides beautiful natural lighting.

Enjoy cabin amenities including a TV/DVD player, heated tile floors in its private bathroom, a hairdryer, bathrobes, shampoo, conditioner, body wash, and binoculars.

Pathfinder Cabin \$13,995 per person (double occupancy) -Cabin B2

Located on the main deck of the boat with easy access to the dining room, salon, bar, and the bow viewing area, the Pathfinder Cabin contains a queen bed with a viewing window.

Enjoy cabin amenities including a TV/DVD player, heated tile floors in its private bathroom, a hairdryer, bathrobes, shampoo, conditioner, body wash, and binoculars.

Room sizes and views are different depending on which cabin you reserve. Please note that we assign guest rooms on a first-come, first-served basis based on booking date. No exceptions.

Admiral Cabin

\$14,980 per person (double occupancy) -Cabins A1 - A4

Located on the bridge deck near the boat's library, the Admiral Cabins contain king, queen, or twin sized beds with a sliding glass door that opens to a small balcony.

Enjoy cabin amenities including a TV/DVD player, heated tile floors in its private bathroom, a hairdryer, bathrobes, shampoo, conditioner, body wash, and binoculars.

FAQ

Our Alaska: Whales & Waterfalls Yacht Adventure requires a moderate level of mobility and physical fitness. You should be able to walk at least four miles unassisted, walk on uneven terrain without established trails, enter and exit large vehicles without assistance, and be physically capable of climbing up and down short stairs or ladders. As there is a significant amount of time spent on water, guests should feel comfortable on boats and skiffs. The ability to participate in light kayaking will also add to one's experience.

Is this departure guaranteed?

Please be aware that this is not a guaranteed departure. We request that you do not book any flights until you receive confirmation of this departure. You will be notified of the tour status no later than April 21, 2025. In the event of a cancellation, we will provide a full refund of the deposit. For more information, you may refer to our <u>Booking Agreement</u>.

Weight & Height Limitations

Unfortunately, there are some weight and height limitations on this tour. Guests taller than 6'5" and/or with waist sizes of more than 44" may not fit in the tandem kayaks. The kayaks are only rated for individuals weighing less than 250lbs (including footwear and clothing). The seats used in the floatplanes are only rated for individuals weighing less than 300 lbs (including footwear and clothing). If you exceed these weight restrictions and let us know in advance, we can offer alternate activities.

How do I sign up?

- Secure your spots with a \$2,000 per person deposit (via phone, email, or on our website) that is fully refundable within 30 days of payment, provided your trip starts at least 121 days from the time of booking. Cancellations processed after 30 days from the time the deposit was placed are not eligible for any refund. The remaining balance is due 120 days before the tour departs.
