

An Expedition Cruise from Ushuaia to the Antarctic Peninsula

This is a rare opportunity to explore Antarctica and witness a world few people will ever experience firsthand.

Designed for travelers seeking depth, leadership, and meaning in one of the last truly wild places on Earth, this journey is crafted as a fully integrated expedition rather than a standalone cruise.

From arrival in Buenos Aires (complete with airport transfers, a hotel stay, guided touring, and a tango experience) through internal flights, curated time in Ushuaia, and a small-group Antarctic expedition led by Gondwana Trip Leaders, the experience is thoughtfully comprehensive.

In Antarctica, all landings, expert guides, crew gratuities, and an optional guided kayaking outing (one per guest), are included, allowing you to focus entirely on exploration and discovery, not logistics.



Trip Highlights

CROSS the legendary Drake Passage with your Gondwana group and expert Trip Leaders on a small expedition ship, keeping watch for albatross, petrels, and whales.

IMMERSE yourself in surreal marine landscapes during frequent Zodiac excursions, weaving among sculpted icebergs, towering glaciers, and dramatic coastlines, with each turn offering breathtaking views.

ENCOUNTER extraordinary wildlife, with possible sightings of Gentoo, Chinstrap, and Adélie penguins; Humpback and Minke whales; Leopard, Weddell, and Fur seals, and much more.

EMBARK on an optional sea kayaking excursion on the continent, gliding among icebergs and exploring Antarctica quietly from the water, surrounded by polar scenery.

EXPLORE one of the least-visited regions on Earth, sailing through waters first charted by early explorers and now studied by scientists, passing historic huts of past adventurers and remote research outposts.

ENJOY included excursions in Buenos Aires and Ushuaia with a Gondwana guide, local cuisine, and curated activities—a comprehensive experience few other cruises provide.

Day One

When you arrive in Buenos Aires, meet your private driver at the airport for a transfer to the hotel. Many flights arrive from the U.S. in the early morning, leaving you time to settle in and relax.

Your adventure begins at 1:00 PM for our Meet & Greet where you'll meet your Trip Leaders and fellow travelers. We'll go over our extraordinary journey ahead and leave time for questions and introductions. After, enjoy a delicious lunch together.

You can choose your own pace with one of two optional experiences: explore the historic Recoleta Cemetery, famed for its ornate mausoleums and rich history, or take a guided city walk departing from the hotel to take in Buenos Aires' vibrant streets and local culture.

As the day winds down, gather for a complimentary dinner at a restaurant near the hotel, sharing your first evening in the city with new friends.

Day Two

In the morning, start with a complimentary breakfast at the hotel.

After, we'll depart for a guided three-hour city tour showcasing Buenos Aires' most iconic neighborhoods and landmarks, including Plaza de Mayo, San Telmo, La Boca, Puerto Madero, and Recoleta. Learn about the city's rich history and dynamic architecture as you explore.

The afternoon is yours to enjoy at leisure. Relax at the hotel with its large indoor swimming pool with a café, a fitness center, jacuzzi, and sauna, or venture out and explore the streets and sights that interest you most.

The evening includes dinner and a world-renowned tango show, which is a wonderful introduction to Argentina's vibrant culture. You'll feel the rhythm, drama, and passion that have made tango one of the most enduring cultural traditions of the area. After the meal, you're welcome to relax on your own if you'd prefer.

Day Three

Following breakfast, we take to the skies on a flight to Ushuaia, the gateway to Antarctica. Set between snow-dusted peaks and the cold blue waters of the Beagle Channel, this striking town is known as *El Fin Del Mundo*—the “End of the World.”

Upon arrival, transfer to your hotel and unwind at the spa, settle in, or take in the dramatic surroundings. Later in the afternoon, meet with the Expedition Team for a pre-expedition briefing, which will help prepare us for the upcoming voyage. In the evening, gather with your fellow travelers for dinner, the anticipation building as our Antarctic adventure nears!



Day Four

After breakfast, embark on an exclusive Gondwana experience: a coastal exploration in Tierra del Fuego National Park. Follow scenic trails along rugged shorelines and quiet forests as your guides share insights into the region’s history, wildlife, and landscapes.

After lunch, you’ll be escorted to the ship, where the Expedition Team and ship staff will welcome you on board and help you get settled. A mandatory safety and orientation briefing follows, setting the stage for what lies ahead. This evening, raise a glass at the Captain’s Welcome Dinner as the ship pulls away from shore and begins its voyage toward Antarctica.

Day Five

Our voyage towards Antarctica begins in earnest as we enter the legendary Drake Passage. The Southern Ocean stretches endlessly around us—one of the most remote and expansive bodies of water on Earth.

As the ship moves south, delve into the fascinating wildlife, ice, and ecosystems of Antarctica through engaging presentations from naturalists, historians and scientists. Enjoy the gym and spa, or spend time on deck watching birds glide effortlessly on the wind, with the chance to spot whales or dolphins moving alongside the ship. With each mile, anticipation builds as we head towards Antarctica.

Day Six

Today we cross the Antarctic Convergence, the biologically rich transition zone that marks our true entrance into Antarctic waters. As temperatures drop, seabird diversity increases, and the ocean takes on a distinctly polar character. Warm up inside with panoramic views from the observation lounge, or head out on deck with a hot drink in hand.

Throughout the day, attend additional lectures and workshops in the ship's presentation spaces, or join Citizen Science efforts that contribute to ongoing research. Between sessions, relax in shared lounges or step outside to keep watch for the first icebergs—the unmistakable sign that Antarctica is near.

Day Seven

Our route moving forward is crafted by the Expedition Team and may change to provide the best opportunities for wildlife viewing and exploration along the peninsula. Weather permitting, we aim to venture off the ship twice daily. Zodiac cruises bring you close to sculpted ice formations and dramatic cliffs, while time ashore allows us to explore penguin colonies, historic sites, and more.

Naturalists accompany you to provide insight into the region's wildlife, history, and ecology, making each landing and cruise a deeply enriching experience. During your journey, you'll also have access to an onboard photography coach who can help with the basics, from camera settings and white balance to adjusting for changing light, so you can feel confident capturing your adventure.

Each evening concludes with a recap of the day's discoveries and a briefing on what lies ahead, setting the stage for the next adventure.

Land appears today as we reach the South Shetland Islands, a volcanic archipelago teeming with wildlife. Encounters with Gentoo, Adélie, and Chinstrap penguins are common, as are sightings of Humpback and Minke whales. Today may be your first opportunity to set foot on Antarctic terrain.

In the evening, we'll regather on board for dinner and a debrief of the day's experiences.

Day Eight

Crossing the Bransfield Strait marks a milestone — welcome to the Antarctic Peninsula, a breathtaking world of towering peaks, shimmering glaciers, and brilliantly colored icebergs. Each day unfolds according to the rhythms of the peninsula itself.

Zodiac excursions take you through iceberg-strewn waters and along secluded bays, bringing you up close to wildlife like resting seals, gliding seabirds, and playful penguins. On land, you may walk among bustling penguin colonies or discover hidden beaches and rocky outcrops teeming with life. Every turn reveals new perspectives of this pristine environment, with sculpted ice, snow-dusted cliffs, and striking volcanic formations forming an unforgettable backdrop.

For those seeking a more immersive experience, optional kayaking provides a quiet, personal way to explore the Antarctic waterways, paddling among icebergs and observing wildlife from near the water's surface. Whether from the Zodiac, the kayak, or onshore, today is about discovery and appreciating the wild beauty of one of the planet's most extraordinary regions.

Later, return to the ship to settle in. Spend some time in the jacuzzi, reflect on the day's experiences with fellow travelers, and enjoy dinner together as you look forward to what's next.

Day Nine

Today brings new opportunities to explore this pristine Antarctic wilderness. Every landing offers a new perspective, revealing the diverse wildlife, history, and scientific importance of the Antarctic Peninsula.

Throughout the day, Zodiac excursions provide another perspective, allowing you to explore narrow channels and iceberg-rich bays that larger vessels cannot access. As you move through calm waters, you'll experience Antarctica at eye level — drifting alongside sculpted ice formations shaped by wind and time. Seals are sometimes spotted resting on ice floes, you may notice seabirds wheeling overhead or diving into the waters below.

Guests who wish may have the opportunity to participate in a polar plunge — a brief, exhilarating immersion in the waters below, when weather and safety conditions allow.

Every landing and cruise deepens your connection to this remarkable environment, highlighting the rich diversity of life and the dramatic landscapes that make the Antarctic Peninsula so iconic.

We conclude the evening with a group briefing to revisit the highlights of the day and dinner together on board.

Day Ten

Our final day on the Peninsula continues the pattern of adventure and discovery. Every site offers a new perspective: mountains rising from the sea, icebergs glowing electric blue, and wildlife thriving in Earth's most remote environment.

Take in the dramatic scenery one last time, whether gliding among icebergs in a Zodiac, observing wildlife onshore, or simply enjoying the view from the ship's deck. Our team ensures each moment is memorable, leaving you with lasting impressions of Antarctica's wild beauty before the ship turns northward.

Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner are included.

Day Eleven

As we set a course back toward South America, the vast expanse of the Southern Ocean offers a moment to reflect on the incredible experiences of the past days. Spend time on deck watching seabirds follow the ship, or simply enjoy the quiet rhythm of life at sea.

Engage in presentations and informal discussions that deepen your understanding of the region's wildlife, geology, and ecosystems. Capture final photographs, share memories with fellow travelers, or simply savor the serenity of the open ocean as you begin the journey home.

Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner are included.





Day Twelve

Our final full day at sea brings a sense of celebration and camaraderie. Our team hosts a farewell slideshow, highlighting memorable moments captured by guests and staff during our time in Antarctica.

This evening, we enjoy a final dinner aboard the ship, closing our sailing voyage with gratitude for the extraordinary landscapes and wildlife we've experienced.

Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner are included.



Day Thirteen

After another fantastic breakfast, we say "until next time" to our friends from the expedition team and to our beautiful expedition ship. But the journey is not over. We head to Arakur Resort & Spa for a final day in Ushuaia at the end of the world.

After checking in, we offer an optional hike in the Arakur Reserve or time to relax and enjoy the hotel's spa. Later in the afternoon, we gather for a Gondwana exclusive farewell dinner at one of Ushuaia's most iconic restaurants, celebrating our shared memories and last evening together.

Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner are included.

Day Fourteen

Breakfast is at the hotel this morning. Afterward, we enjoy one final hike in a beautiful forest of Lengas and Guindos, stopping along the way at scenic viewpoints of the Andes. The last stretch offers sweeping views of the Beagle Channel below.

With hearts full and cameras loaded with memories, we bid farewell and transfer to the airport for our included flight back to Buenos Aires.

Arakur Resort & Spa

Ushuaia (Nights 3 & 13)

Located within the Cerro Alarkén Natural Reserve, and overlooking the icy waters of the Beagle Channel, the Arakur Resort & Spa offers rooms and suites with contemporary décor, plush bedding, high-speed Wi-Fi, and private terraces with sweeping views of the surrounding mountains and channel. The amenities include a spa, indoor and outdoor heated pools, a fitness center, sauna, and more.

Accommodations Onboard

During this expedition, we will be using the Ocean Albatros ship (built in 2023).


It carries up to 175 passengers. It features multiple observation decks and access points, presentation spaces with sweeping 180° views, and two outdoor Jacuzzis offering panoramic scenery. Onboard comforts also include a library, a 24/7 coffee and tea station, and a well-appointed wellness center with a spa, sauna, and gym. Indulge in a late-night snack at the 24/7 bistro on deck 8 or sip on a handcrafted cocktail at the bar on deck 7.

This small-ship experience allows for quick, secure Zodiac landings, more time with our expedition crew, and a more personalized and personable experience than on bigger ships where it's easy to feel lost in the crowd.




Cabin Layouts





Superior Balcony Stateroom

Located on deck 6, this cabin features either a double bed (queen) or two single beds, a comfortable indoor seating area, and a balcony with lounge chairs. If you are prone to seasickness, request a cabin on deck 4 for less movement in rough seas. These include a step-out railing area rather than a full balcony. It accommodates two guests.

Enjoy cabin amenities including exterior views, a mini-fridge, flat-screen TV, telephone, an in-room safe for valuables, independent temperature controls, toiletries, a hair dryer, a bathrobe, and USB sockets.



Grand Balcony Stateroom

Located on deck 4, the Grand Balcony Stateroom is a more spacious balcony accommodation and being lower, is a great option for those prone to seasickness. It features a balcony, outdoor seating, and either a double bed (queen) or two single beds. It accommodates two guests.

Enjoy stateroom amenities including exterior views, a mini-fridge, flat-screen TV, telephone, an in-room safe for valuables, independent temperature controls, toiletries, a hair dryer, a bathrobe, and USB sockets.



Balcony Suite

Located on deck 6, the balcony suite offers a spacious retreat and excellent views. It features a large balcony, outdoor seating, a workstation, and either a double bed (queen) or two single beds. It accommodates two guests.

Enjoy suite-exclusive amenities including exterior views, a regularly restocked mini-fridge and a Nespresso machine. It also includes a flat-screen TV, telephone, an in-room safe for valuables, independent temperature controls, toiletries, a hair dryer, a bathrobe, and USB sockets.



Junior Suite

Located on deck 7 near the bar, fitness center, jacuzzi, and closest to the observation deck, this balcony stateroom features a double bed (queen) or twin beds. It also has a comfortable seating area, and a private balcony, the largest of our room offerings, for incredible views of spotting wildlife. It can accommodate two guests.

Enjoy suite-exclusive amenities including exterior views, outdoor seating, a regularly restocked mini-fridge and a Nespresso machine. It also includes a flat-screen TV, telephone, an in-room safe for valuables, independent temperature controls, toiletries, a hair dryer, a bathrobe, and USB sockets.



Dining Onboard

Enjoy a premium dining experience onboard the ship with an on-site culinary team dedicated to using fresh, high quality ingredients.

Breakfast is available each morning, with a selection of hot and cold items to fuel your day of exploration. Lunch is served buffet-style in the main restaurant. You'll find a variety of hot and cold dishes, salads, sandwiches, and daily specials, with vegetarian, healthy, and other dietary options available. Any individual preferences, allergies, or restrictions shared on your registration form are communicated to the culinary team in advance. Don't forget to leave room for dessert, prepared by the onboard pastry chefs.

Dinner features a selection of thoughtfully prepared meals using seasonal and local ingredients, with options for wine or non-alcoholic beverages. The à la carte menu will offer a range of dishes including ones with an American focus and others highlighting international cuisine.

In addition to the main restaurant, there is also a casual grill on deck 8, which provides a relaxed setting and buffet-style meals.

The onboard bar offers a variety of cocktails and spirits, perfect for relaxing after a day of adventures or enjoying the views from the deck.



Restaurants


Ramos Generales

Ramos Generales El Almacén is one of Ushuaia's most beloved dining spots. Housed in a beautifully restored former general store, the restaurant blends Patagonian tradition with contemporary comfort. The menu focuses on dishes made with regional ingredients, including fresh seafood, grilled meats, homemade pastas, soups, and daily specials that change with the season. House-baked breads and classic Argentine desserts round out the experience, while the wine list and craft beers showcase local and national selections.



La Cravia

La Cravia is the main restaurant at the Arakur Ushuaia Resort & Spa. It features Argentine and international dishes with options from buffet to à la carte, including regional specialties like grilled meats, king crab, lamb, and Patagonian sea bass — all served with sweeping views of the Beagle Channel and surrounding mountains.

FAQ

Is this trip for me?

- Antarctica: Penguins & Polar Frontiers requires a moderate level of mobility and physical fitness. You should be able to walk at least 3 miles unassisted, walk on uneven terrain without established trails, enter and exit large vehicles without assistance, and be physically capable of climbing up and down stairs or ladders. As there is a significant amount of time spent on water, guests should feel comfortable on the ship and Zodiacs.
- Please note that the minimum age for all of our tours is 12. Some activities may also have specific age restrictions. However, we may be able to make exceptions in certain cases. For more information or to inquire about younger participants, please email our Guest Services department at info@gondwanaecotours.com. Minors under 18 are not permitted in shared cabins; they must room with a guardian over 21 included on their booking.

What are the travel insurance requirements for this tour?

- For all Gondwana Ecotours expeditions to Antarctica, travel insurance **is mandatory and must be purchased at the time of booking your tour**. Insurance must provide a minimum of \$150,000 USD in coverage for medical expenses, emergency evacuation and repatriation, pre-existing medical conditions, and COVID-19.
- One plan we know and recommend is the Ultimate Plan from TravelEx Insurance. This plan **includes coverage for pre-existing conditions if you purchase the plan within 21 days of paying your tour deposit**. Visit the Travelex website [here](#) for the details and to get a quote. The “Agency location number” is 18-0118.
- The TravelEx Ultimate Plan meets the requirements stated above and is the only plan we have reviewed. Guests may purchase a different policy but must confirm it satisfies the outlined requirements, as we are unable to review alternative plans. If coverage does not meet the required limits and boarding is denied, refunds or credits cannot be provided.
- **After you book your tour, we will share more important information regarding the travel insurance requirements for this trip by email.**

How cold will it be in Antarctica?

- Although Antarctica is officially the coldest place on earth, we’ll visit during the summer when temperatures are frequently above freezing, typically ranging from 32°–41°F (0°–5°C).

FAQ Continued

How long is the passage from Ushuaia to Antarctica? Will I get seasick?

- Cruises to Antarctica depart from Ushuaia on the southern tip of Argentina and need to cross the Drake Passage to reach the continent. The crossing generally takes 48 hours, but can be more or less depending on weather and sea conditions. The seas in the Drake Passage are unpredictable and can be rough, calm or somewhere in between. Once in the islands and along the Antarctic Peninsula, conditions are typically much calmer for that portion of the journey.
- To reduce the chance of seasickness, prepare with medication (Dramamine), use acupuncture bands, and try natural remedies like ginger. In particular, many travelers find scopolamine (Scop) patches particularly helpful. Other tips include focusing on the horizon, staying hydrated, eating bland foods, and avoiding alcohol during the passage.

Weight & Height Limitations
