ENJOY an unforgettable Andean panpipes performance, widely regarded as one of the best folkloric performances in South America.

Day One

Welcome to Peru! Arrive at Alfredo Rodriguez Ballon International Airport (AQP) in the morning or early afternoon and enjoy a private transfer to your downtown hotel in Arequipa. Known as ‘the city of white volcanic rock’, Arequipa is built at the foothills of three volcanoes—Misti, Chachani, and Pichu Pichu.

Our journey begins with a 5 p.m. Meet & Greet, where you'll get an overview of the days ahead—an unforgettable adventure through the highlands and heritage of Peru and Bolivia—and have a chance to connect with your fellow travelers, followed by dinner.

Day Two

Following breakfast at the hotel, we'll begin our first day of adventure with a walking tour of Arequipa's UNESCO-listed historic center. Explore the Plaza de Armas, admire the Cathedral of Arequipa's volcanic stone structure, and visit the Jesuit Church of La Compañía.

Then, take in the splendor of this city at Yanahuara, a historic district known for its breathtaking views, where we'll have lunch. Stroll through the local market and artisan streets in the afternoon. Return to the hotel afterwards for some rest before dinner at a local restaurant.

Day Three

After breakfast, explore San Camilo Market, Arequipa's oldest and most traditional public market. Experience local culture and learn about the unique ingredients used in Peruvian cuisine. Next, we'll visit the Monastery of Santa Catalina, a sprawling, centuries-old convent. Spanning over 20,000 square meters, this vibrant complex feels like a city within a city.

After lunch at a local *picantería*, we'll visit Museo Santuarios Andinos to learn about *Mummy Juanita*, a well-preserved Inca girl discovered atop Mount Ampato. This mummy offers insight into Incan culture, spiritual practices, and beliefs. Enjoy some free time relaxing in a café or shopping for local crafts before we return to the hotel for dinner and rest.

Day Four

After breakfast, we'll depart and begin our journey to Colca Canyon—one of the five deepest canyons in the world. We'll begin this drive through the Salinas and Aguada Blanca National Reserve, home to wildlife like guanaco, puma, and vicuña.

Along the way, we'll travel over the Patapampa Pass, reaching an altitude of 16,109 ft. (4,910 meters) above sea level. From this altitude, enjoy sweeping views of the rugged terrain and Mount Mismi—the source of the Amazon River. We'll stop for lunch at a local restaurant in a small Andean village, indulging in tasty traditional dishes and warm drinks to help with acclimating to the altitude.

During our drive through the highlands, we'll encounter diverse wildlife like vicuñas, llamas, alpacas, Andean foxes, and flamingos. Learn more about how these animals adapt and thrive in extreme elevations. We'll be on the lookout for these fascinating species as the wonders of the Andes unfold before us. We descend into the Colca Valley, passing through traditional Andean villages.

After arriving at the hotel, you can rest or take a relaxing soak in its natural hot springs before dinner.

Day Five

Following an early breakfast at the hotel, we'll depart for Cruz del Condor, the most famous viewpoint in Colca Canyon. Witness the breathtaking sight of Andean Condors soaring majestically over the deep canyon. These massive birds have wingspans reaching up to ten feet and glide on thermal currents during their daily search for food. Observe their routine and learn more about their significance in Andean culture and mythology.

We'll continue our drive across the Andean highlands towards Puno. The dramatic cliffs and winding roads make it feel as though the earth has split open to reveal this vast landscape. Admire the surrounding snow-capped peaks, vast plains, and herds of wild animals like vicuñas, alpacas, and llamas that roam freely. We'll stop for lunch at a local restaurant, sampling traditional dishes.

Our drive continues until we reach Puno, located on the shores of Lake Titicaca. This lake is the highest navigable lake in the world at 12,507 feet (3,810 meters) above sea level. Upon arrival, we'll check into a waterfront hotel, offering a perfect place to relax and acclimatize. After settling in, join an optional lakeside walk. We'll hopefully watch a beautiful sunset cast a golden hue over the waters of Lake Titicaca before gathering for dinner.

Day Six

After an early breakfast, we'll head to the pier and board a motorized boat for an exciting day on Lake Titicaca. Explore the floating community of the Uros, an indigenous people who live on floating islands made by totora reeds. Learn more about their fascinating way of life as you explore their remarkable homes. Then, take a short ride in a traditional totora reed canoe, a practice that dates back thousands of years.

Next, we visit Taquile Island, which is often considered the most beautiful island on the lake. Stroll past terraced fields, rolling hills, and panoramic views of the glittering lake and surrounding mountains on a guided walk. This area is also known for UNESCO-recognized textile art, made by local artisans who create intricate woven garments that symbolize their cultural heritage. Meet the island's Quechua-speaking locals, learn about their ancient customs that have been preserved for generations, and admire their remarkable textiles up close. We'll sit down for a traditional lunch prepared by the islanders, featuring local trout, quinoa soup, and muña tea (a high-altitude medicinal herb).

After spending time on the island, we'll reboard our boat and head back to Puno for a relaxing lakeside evening.

Day Seven

After breakfast we'll begin the day with a scenic drive along the shores of Lake Titicaca. We're driving to La Paz, Bolivia, today, and it's one of the most breathtaking routes in the Andes! Take in the incredible sights of the vast lake, traditional Andean villages, and the majestic Cordillera Real mountain range.

Following international border procedures, we head to Copacabana for lunch, a legendary beach town on Lake Titicaca. We cross the Tiquina Strait by boat and continue on to La Paz, Bolivia's high-altitude capital.

The transition from rural landscapes to the sprawling city nestled within a deep valley is quite dramatic. Once we arrive, enjoy an overhead look of La Paz from a modern cable car. The aerial ride provides an expansive view of the city's vibrant neighborhoods, rugged mountain terrain, and bustling streets below.

We check in at the Ritz Apart Hotel for a leisurely evening and enjoy a welcome dinner featuring Bolivian cuisine, such as *salteñas*, llama steak, or the famous *sajta de pollo*.

Day Eight

Following breakfast, prepare for an exciting day in La Paz, the world's highest altitude capital city—11,975 feet (3,650 meters)! We'll begin our day with a cable car ride and visit to Plaza Murillo, the city's historic square that's home to the Presidential Palace, the National Congress building, and the La Paz Cathedral.

After, we'll drive to the Killi Killi Lookout Point, one of the best viewpoints in the city before exploring local markets and landmarks. We'll learn more about local culture and spiritual traditions, admire Baroque-Mestizo architecture, and see an array of Bolivian handicrafts, textiles, and souvenirs.

After lunch at a local restaurant, we'll drive to Valle de la Luna (Moon Valley), a surreal landscape of eroded clay formations that resemble a lunar surface. Enjoy a short hike through the unique landscape and learn about the region's geological history. The afternoon is yours to explore the city center, browse local shops, or take a leisurely stroll.

In the evening, experience an unforgettable Andean-Pipes show at Restaurant Wari, widely regarded as one of the best folkloric performances in South America. The live music and dance showcase Bolivia's rich cultural heritage and is paired with a delicious traditional Bolivian dinner featuring local flavors.

Day Nine

After breakfast, we'll transfer to the airport for our flight to Uyuni. Located in southwestern Bolivia, this town is known for its salt flats and vibrant history. The flight offers beautiful aerial views of the vast, arid landscapes of the Altiplano region.

Upon arrival, we'll visit the Train Cemetery, a collection of old steam locomotives and rail cars that date back to the early days of Bolivia's railroad system. After lunch at a local restaurant, we'll drive to the Pulacayo Mine.

Pulacayo is one of the oldest and most important mining towns in Bolivia. The mine was once a key source of silver during the colonial era and played a significant role in Bolivia's industrial revolution. Explore the remnants of the mine, including abandoned buildings, tunnels, and equipment. The area offers a glimpse into the harsh working conditions of miners from centuries past and the deep historical connection to Bolivia's mining culture.

After a day of exploration, we will return to Uyuni and check in at Luna Salada Lodge. Relax and unwind after the day's adventure with a hearty dinner and an evening of rest.

Day Ten

Following breakfast at the hotel, we'll begin our journey to one of the most remarkable natural wonders on Earth—the Uyuni Salt Flat. We'll drive across the vast, white expanse of salt, which stretches over 4,000 square miles (10,000 square kilometers) and is the largest salt flat in the world*.

Our first stop is Colchani, a small village located at the edge of the salt flat. Here, we learn about the traditional methods used by locals to harvest salt from the flat. We also visit a salt treatment plant to see how raw salt is processed and prepared for sale.

We'll visit Incahuasi Island next (also known as Fish Island), a small hill of ancient volcanic rock rising from the middle of the salt flat. The island is famous for its giant cactus plants, some of which are over 700 years old. We'll enjoy a picnic lunch on the island and take in the surreal views.

During our journey back, we'll find a perfect spot to enjoy the sunset over the salt flat. We return to Uyuni for our final night in town. We gather for our farewell dinner at the hotel. A delicious selection of Bolivian cuisine and international dishes will be served, and we will toast to the unforgettable experiences shared over the course of our journey.

Take in stunning aerial views of the Andes mountain range and La Paz's unique location in a vast valley surrounded by towering peaks.

The guides will either drop you off at the El Alto International Airport (LPB) or at a downtown hotel depending on your plans.

Relax in its rustic yet chic rooms and enjoy a range of amenities like an on-site restaurant, a game room, outdoor hot springs, and more.




GHL Titicaca Hotel

Luna Salada Lodge


Nights 9-10

Nazca Lines & Pisco Tasting Day Two


Welcome to Lima! Your adventure begins with an early pick-up from your hotel followed by a short drive to the city's traditional coastal district, Chorrillos. Here, you'll visit a lively seafood market and fishing port, where you can watch artisanal fishers in action and lightly sample fresh flavors.

After, journey along the famed Pan-American Highway, one of the longest in the world, with a short coffee and rest stop along the way. Admire views of the coastal desert landscapes and rural communities. Around mid-day, arrive at Bodega Tres Generaciones, a peaceful family-run vineyard. Savor a private 3 course lunch crafted with local flavors, served under the shade in a quiet garden or among the vines.

In the afternoon, enjoy a guided pisco tasting at the estate, featuring a tour of the vineyard and distillation areas. Learn about the distillation process and sample a variety of grape-based spirits including Quebranta and Italia.

By late afternoon, check in at La Hacienda Bahía Paracas, a hotel on the bay known for its stunning views. In the evening, dine at the hotel restaurant and choose from a menu of freshly caught seafood and regional specialties.

Nazca Lines & Pisco Tasting Day Three

Following an early breakfast at the hotel, enjoy a private transfer to the Pisco Airport for our flightseeing activity.

Board a light aircraft for a 90-minute panoramic flight over the Nazca Lines. This series of mysterious geoglyphs, etched into the desert floor more than 1,500 years ago, are an ancient marvel. Best seen in the air, a scenic flight over the lines allows us to see the impressive scale of these geoglyphs, whose origins and purpose are still a mystery to this day. Notable formations include the Hummingbird, the Monkey, the Condor, and more.

Return to the hotel later in the morning to freshen up or drink a coffee by the bay before our departure for Lima. Enjoy a comfortable return trip along the Pan-American Highway and indulge in lunch with views along the Pacific coastline. In the afternoon, arrive at the airport to board our flight to Arequipa.

A private transfer returns us from the airport to Casa Andina Premium Hotel where we check-in and freshen up before our Meet & Greet dinner, which kicks off the activities of the main tour.

This post-tour extension brings you to Machu Picchu, one of the most famous archaeological sites in the world! Fly a little over an hour to Cusco, the gateway to Machu Picchu. Spend one night here, before taking a train to the famous UNESCO World Heritage Site. Admire the stone temples, terraces, and ceremonial plazas of this ancient citadel, nestled amongst the Andes mountains. Often called the “Lost City of the Incas”, you’ll learn more about the history, engineering, and culture of the Incan Empire during a guided visit.

Following the conclusion of the main tour, fly from La Paz, Bolivia to Cusco, Peru in the afternoon. Upon arrival, enjoy a private transfer to your hotel, which is located in the heart of Cusco's beautiful historic district.

The evening is yours to enjoy! Relax or walk through the cobble streets of Cusco's center, where centuries-old architecture meets vibrant modern life. After, we'll dine at a local Peruvian restaurant and experience the city's culinary charm.

Machu Picchu Day Two

After an early breakfast at the hotel, we depart by train for a memorable journey through the Sacred Valley—once an agricultural center for the Incas.

Upon arrival, we take a shuttle bus to the entrance of Machu Picchu, where our specialist guide leads a private tour of the iconic citadel. Spanning over 32,000 hectares, this UNESCO World Heritage Site, often called the "Lost City of the Incas", remains one of the world's great archaeological mysteries. Our tour focuses on the main citadel and runs about two to three hours, with moderate walking on uneven paths, and a few short climbs and descents.

After the tour concludes, we transfer by shuttle to Aguas Calientes for a buffet lunch at a local restaurant before taking the train back to Cusco. The evening is yours for rest and relaxation at the hotel.

Machu Picchu Day Three

After a good night's rest we begin to say our goodbyes as this is the end of our adventure.

Our guides will transfer you to Cusco's Alejandro Velasco Astete International Airport (CUZ) for your departing flights home.

Is This Trip For Me?

- Our Peru & Bolivia Adventure requires moderate mobility and physical fitness. You should be able to walk on uneven, natural terrain hiking trails for at least three miles unassisted. You must also be physically able to comfortably enter and exit vans, buses, planes, and boats, without assistance. We spend time at high altitudes, reaching 16,000 ft., so guests must feel comfortable with the effects of thinner air and lower oxygen levels while walking. We will provide many opportunities for rest and acclimatization.

Please note that the minimum age for all of our tours is twelve years old. Some activities may also have specific age restrictions. However, we may be able to make exceptions in certain cases. Where do we arrive and depart from?

- On the first day of the tour, please arrive at the Arequipa's Alfredo Rodriguez Ballon International Airport (AQP). On the last day of the tour, most guests will likely depart from El Alto International Airport (LPB) in La Paz, Bolivia.

When should I arrive in Arequipa?

- You should arrive in at Alfredo Rodriguez Ballon International Airport (AQP) during the morning or afternoon on Day One of the tour. If you wish to arrive early and spend more time in Arequipa, let us know if you would like help booking pre-tour nights at the hotel.

What if I want to come explore other parts of the country before or after the trip?

- We recommend joining our pre-trip extension to the Nazca Lines & Pisco Tasting in Peru. Here you'll experience coastal culture, winemaking traditions, and a visit to the fabled Nazca Lines. Begin in Lima's coastal district of Chorrillos and visit a bustling market and fishing port. Travel along the scenic Pan-American Highway for a private vineyard lunch and guided pisco-tasting at a family-run estate. The next day, take to the skies for a scenic flight over the Nazca Lines. This series of mysterious geoglyphs, etched into the desert floor more than 1,500 years ago, are an ancient marvel.
- We also recommend joining our post-trip extension to Machu Picchu, one of the most famous archaeological sites in the world! Take a 45-minute flight to Cusco, the gateway to Machu Picchu. Spend one night here, before taking a train to the famous UNESCO World Heritage Site.
- If you'd like to visit other parts of Peru or Bolivia prior to or after your trip, let us know if you want any travel tips!
